SELF-REGULATION

After the fantastic performance from B5 in their assembly, I thought this would be a great time to share more information about one of the ways we teach children about emotional regulation. The program Zones of Regulation, highlights 4 zones, each zone representing different feelings. This is a great program to explicitly teach children the different types of emotions and how they feel inside our bodies and how they present on the outside. Once we can begin to identify our emotions and feelings, we can investigate the triggers for each of these and develop a 'toolbox' of strategies to support us in expressing them appropriately. This can also be described as expected and unexpected behaviours. For more information and understanding of the emotions that relate to each zone, follow the link and question your child on what emotions they have been feeling today.
