

achieve their very best. To get the best education, they need to attend school every day. Developing a habit of going to school every day is vitally important so your child does not miss out on important ideas and skills they need for future learning.

Why is going to school so important for my child?

- At school, many concepts are taught in a sequence. Missing school means missing out on learning - which can often make it difficult to catch up later. This is particularly important when essential foundation skills are being taught.
- Going to school every day helps children learn the important life skill of 'showing up' - at school, at work, to sport and other commitments.
- Western Research from the Australian Telethon Kids Institute shows that every day at school counts towards a student's learning. Students who attend more, generally do better at school and in life.

Did you know:

- Missing half a day of school each week equates to one month of missed learning each
- The attendance habits set by children when they first start school continue throughout their school life.
- If children miss half a day of school each week between Pre-primary and Year 10, they would miss almost one full year of learning.
- Learning is cumulative if children miss a day, it is harder for them to catch up.

Do you need to let the school know if your child will be away from school?

Yes, you need to let the teacher or front office know the reason why your child is going to be, or has been, absent from school as soon as possible. Having information about why your child is absent from school helps us plan for their return to school and work out any additional support that may be required.

What if my child is sick?

The school is not asking parents to send students to school when they are genuinely sick. Staying home aids a faster recovery and also prevents the spread of the illness throughout the school.
