#### **OUR SCHOOL - TALKING ABOUT YOUR DAY**

As our children get older, they become less likely to spontaneously engage in a conversation about their day at school. Yet the thought processes and skills that are required to recap the events of the day are still just as important as in the junior years. Making the effort to have a quick chat with your child makes a difference as you get an ongoing picture of what they are doing and can help them in guiding them through any difficult issues.

Be specific and listen to what they say. You'll find communication will improve. Here are some ideas:

"What made you laugh today?"

"What happened today that was totally unexpected?"

"Who did you see that made you happy?"
"What did you enjoy doing the most today?"

Each of these questions gets your child to remember something specific, shifts their mind from the routine of saying "Fine" in order to recap an entire day, and gets them to talk about something positive. In saying this, you don't have to steer clear of the negative stuff, but if you listen carefully you can help your child put it in perspective and come up with a plan of action for ways to solve it.

But what do you do if the story is a negative one? Here are some questions from the Restorative Justice Model that may help you to guide your child through solving the issues they face. Talking through an issue with your child using this model will encourage them to consider the feelings of others as well as their own, and to come up with practical steps they can take to put things right. This will go a long way to helping them develop strong interpersonal skills.

#### When things go wrong:

- What happened?
- What were you thinking at the time?
- What have you thought about since?
- Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?
- What do you think you need to do to make things right?

#### When someone has been hurt:

- What did you think when you realised what had happened?
- What impact has this incident had on you and others?
- What has been the hardest thing for you?
- What do you think needs to happen to make things right?



#### **CANTEEN 2025**

Planning is underway for the canteen to re-open next year under the management of Compass Group through ESS. This has been a joint initiative between the P&C, School, Boddington Police and Compass and we are very fortunate to be receiving such extensive support from Compass on this project. Parents will be informed of further details regarding the canteen once they are finalised.

#### **SWIMMING LESSONS**

We are halfway through our P-2 Interm Swimming lessons which are run over two weeks so that students are able to complete an 8 lesson program. Thank you to all parents who have worked with the school to support the Interm Swimming program and ensure their child is prepared and ready to participate in the lessons. Thank you also, to Mr Scott George and the P-2 school staff who, as always, have gone above and beyond to ensure our students are able to participate in the program.

#### **SECONDARY CAMP**
