From the Principal

It has been a busy couple of weeks at Boddington DHS with swimming lessons and students settling into the daily routines of school. It has been very pleasing to see students achieving our positive behaviour expectations and 'doing their best'. I have noticed all students making an effort to move around the school quietly during lesson times and quickly after the play breaks so that they are at class on time. Our current PBS expectation is 'Responsible: We respect and look after the school environment'. When students are seen to demonstrate this expectation they receive additional individual Dojo points. Students can then earn rewards when they reach Dojo milestones. Students are also rewarded at a whole school level when the combined Dojo points of ALL the students reach certain targets. The first target is 5000 points and the reward is VIP Recess. Students are on track to reach this target next week as we are currently on 3906 Dojo's after only 10 days of school. VIP recess is when all students have an additional 15 minutes of play time and a variety of equipment is put out for students to use in the playground.

P&C ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The P&C Annual General Meeting will be held today, Wednesday 19 February, in the school library at 3.15pm. We look forward to having as many parents and family members attend as possible. The P&C raised a significant amount of money for our school last year and assisted in providing an enhanced learning environment and resources for our students. OUR SCHOOL - POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT

At Boddington DHS we are committed to educating our students through Positive Behaviour Support (PBS). PBS uses a consistent whole school approach and common language in regard to behaviour expectations, creating positive learning environments. This is achieved by developing proactive systems to define, teach and support appropriate students' behaviours.

BDHS have **3 core values** which we would like to see the staff and students display throughout the school.

The 3 core values for positive behaviour at BDHS are:

- Strive Do your best
- Considerate Be caring and mindful of others
- Responsible Do what is expected and own your actions

These core expectations are symbolised in our PBS logo and outlined in explicit detail, in our **Behaviour Expectation Matrix**. The PBS team in consultation with staff developed the behaviour matrix. Please familiarise yourself with the expectations matrix which is attached to this newsletter.

Our Behaviour Expectation Matrix assists us to:

- Actively teach students the behaviour we want to see
- Rewards students for positive behaviour
- Raise expectations
- Promote positive learning culture
- Hold everyone in the school community accountable for the development of a positive learning environment

Our PBS Logo was designed in collaboration with our students. The leaves on the tree represent the different elements of our community and school. The branches of the tree represent our three expectations and that all three branches are needed

for the tree to grow strong. The tree, sitting on the hills of Boddington, reminds us that through working together and learning in a supportive and inclusive environment, all students can learn, grow and succeed.



YEAR 7 & 10 IMMUNISATIONS

Community Nurses from Southern Wheatbelt Primary Health Service will be visiting Boddington DHS this term on Wednesday, 2 April 2025 to conduct immunisations for Year 7 and 10 students. Electronic consent forms and information sheets will be emailed to parents by the school in the coming week. If you are unable to complete an electronic consent, a paper-based consent is also available and can be collected from the front office.

ON ENTRY ASSESMENT

Over the next few weeks our pre-primary students will be doing the On-entry Assessment Program which is an assessment for learning, rather than an assessment of learning. Conducting this assessment early in the year ensures that the teachers have information about current the skills and understandings of each child to assist in the planning and delivery of targeted learning programs that address the needs of each individual, especially those who may require early intervention or extension. The assessment period is during Weeks 4 – 6 of Term 1.

YEAR 3 - 6 TENNIS COACHING

This term the school was successful in receiving a Primary Sporting Schools Grant of \$2,250 enabling us to provide 4 weeks of tennis coaching lessons with coach Keith O'Brien to students in Year 3-6. These lessons will start next week on Tuesday 25 February, with each class going over to the tennis courts for a half hour lesson on Tuesdays.

SWIMMING CARNIVAL

The school Faction Swimming Carnival will be held on Friday, 7 March at the town pool. Students from Years 3 to 10 will have the opportunity to compete for their faction in a variety of swimming events. Parents and family members are encouraged to come along and support their children on the day. Information about this event will be sent home closer to the day.

ABSENTEE PROCESS

If your child is absent from school, please notify either their class teacher or the school office of the reason for their absence. Children who are sick are NOT expected to attend school, however, it is important that the school is notified of their absence.

ASSEMBLY

Our first assembly for the year will be on Thursday 6 March (Week 5) at 8:50 in the undercover area. It will be presented by the Year 5 students in M2.


